# DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT'S CABINET

<u>Call to Order:</u> A regular meeting of the President's Cabinet was held in the President's Conference Room on January 9, 2023. The meeting convened at 1:30 p.m. with Dr. Caston presiding.

#### **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

On motion by Dr. Lovin and seconded by Dr. Novobilski, all Cabinet Members present and participating voted unanimously to approve the Minutes of the Cabinet Meeting held on December 7, 2022.

#### **GENERAL OVERVIEW**

- Mr. Kinnison provided an update on Athletics. All student-athletes participating in Spring sports begin practice this week. Student-athletes on teams competing in the Fall will begin off-season practice next week. The men's and women's basketball teams hosted West Georgia over the weekend; and, they will host Union University and Christian Brothers University on Thursday and Saturday, respectively. The swimming and diving teams defeated University of Montevallo and Ouachita Baptist University over the weekend. They will host Henderson State University on Saturday. Mr. Kinnison provided an update on Gulf South Conference members. Shorter University will align with Conference Carolina after the 2023 football season. North Greenville University may align with Conference Carolina after the 2024 football season; however, the decision is not final at this time. To help with football scheduling issues, the GSC Commissioner has contacted Chowan University about a provisional, two-year membership. Other options for provisional members are being discussed.
- Mr. Wakefield shared an update on Facilities projects. Lighting for the School of Nursing renovation project is being installed. Also, security cameras are ordered. Bidding for the Nowell Union boiler replacement project begins next week. The university will use \$1.9 million in ARPA funds to install a new pump on the west side of campus to help with drainage issues. A design professional has been assigned. The design engineer for the HVAC project was chosen. The university is trimming trees throughout campus for better lighting and security camera coverage. The roof for Kent Wyatt Hall will be repaired next week. Due to freezing temperatures during the holiday, the university experienced issues with burst pipes. Consultants are coming to assess the problem. The Digital Media Arts Center experienced flooding, and staff are working out of Jobe Hall.
- Dr. Caston shared with Cabinet members some of the meetings and events planned for this week.
   Classes for Spring 2023 began today. The university will be closed next Monday in observance of the Martin Luther King Holiday.

FEMA Designation of Applicant Agent for Public Assistance ...... Mr. Wakefield

Mr. Wakefield, as the Interim Vice President for Finance and Administration, needs approval by Cabinet members to serve as Delta State's Applicant Agent for Public Assistance from FEMA. As the designated Applicant Agent, Mr. Wakefield will be authorized to execute applications for the purpose of obtaining and administering certain federal financial assistance under the Disaster Relief Act of 1974 (Public Law 93.228), amended by Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act of 1988, (Public Law 100-707) and to file them with the Governor's Authorized Representative.

**Motion:** Moved by Dr. Novobilski to approve Mr. Wakefield as Delta State's Applicant Agent and seconded by Dr. Lovin. The motion was approved.

#### Discussion

Institutional Effectiveness and Planning......Dr. Novobilski

Dr. Novobilski provided Cabinet members with a SACSCOC reaffirmation update. The writing team is progressing well and focusing on completing drafts for sections one through six of the university's strategic planning report (attached.) The newly created assessment fellows are contacting units lacking an Administrative Unit Assessment. Dr. Beverly Moon agreed to assist Dr. Welsh with finalizing Standard 7 which relates to strategic planning institutional history and alignment. Dr. Nuria Cuevas will be on campus for a site visit on February 21-22. Dr. Novobilski requested that the Cabinet members, as the Strategic Plan Steering Committee, meet to discuss the strategic plan outside of regularly scheduled Cabinet meeting.

Recruitment Update/Overview.......Dr. Lovin

Dr. Lovin provided an update and overview of recruitment. He had a meeting with Mr. Trey Wright, Managing Partner for Higher Education at Kaye/Bassman International Corporation, to discuss the Director of Admissions position announcement and applicants. EAB representatives will be on campus in February to discuss additional strategies for recruiting. The university has 105,000 prospects in our system to recruit to the university. Of those accepted prior to Christmas, 630 were admitted to the university prior to the holidays. Also, 63 students have registered for Spring Takin' Care of Business Days. Delta State's Honor Band Weekend is this weekend, and 255 students will be on campus for the event. The Office of Admissions scheduled Silent Disco for those students on Friday evening in the Leroy E. Morganti Atrium. Dr. Novobilski announced the enrollment for graduate students as of today is 649, and an additional 50 students are waiting to be admitted and registered. The enrollment for graduate students on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of classes in the Fall was 680. Enrollment for the university was 2,057 this morning.

#### **Additional Information**

- Mr. Munroe provided an update on the Centennial Campaign and shared an upcoming event will be hosted in Gulfport in February.
- Mr. Munroe shared with Cabinet members a legislative session update. The IHL system will lobby the
  legislature for bond funds, appropriations, and Repair and Renovation funds. In addition to those
  requests, Delta State will request funds for the university's four earmarks DMI, the Delta Center,
  Commercial Aviation, and E-Learning and a re-appropriation of \$2.4 million for facilities projects.
